Intelligence and cleverness, great lineage, control of the senses, scientific pursuit fearlessness, measured speech, philanthropy and gratitude are the qualities that differentiate a great man.



Shri N J Yasaswy (1950 – 2011), Founder of the ICFAI group

He was a man of great charm and an attraction among his classmates, juniors and seniors as well. He was venerated by equals; emulated by juniors and appreciated by teachers. To put it briefly, he was a ‘friend, philosopher and guide’ to us in our lives.

Born on 9th February, at Tenali in Guntur District of Andhra Pradesh, Shri N J Yasaswy was the only child of Shri Nandury Venkateswara Rao, a teacher and Smt. Seetharamamma.

Shri N. J. Yasaswy, the visionary founder of the ICFAI group of educational institutions and a great human being. Yasaswy was indubitably a versatile genius and a man of many parts. That aside, he had a tremendous capacity to take risks but always launched every initiative with an amazing clarity: ‘ours is a private effort with a public purpose.’ Being an erudite leader, whenever a new initiative was undertaken, he would invariably emphasize to his colleagues: “We are aiming at a future beyond our ken and control; let us, therefore, be open to learn and steer through cautiously.”

SWAMI VIVEKANANDA - MY IDEAL

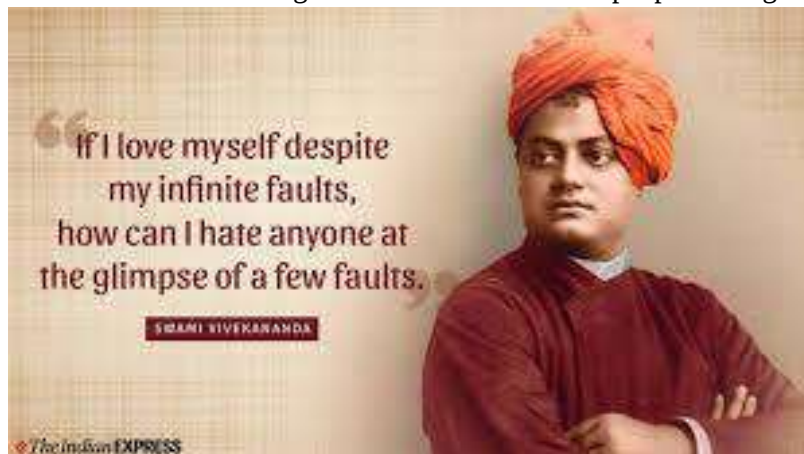
figure made an irresistible appeal to the many kinds of Americans who came into contact with him.

Microfinance, also called MICRO-CREDIT is a type of banking service provided to unemployed or low-income individuals or groups who otherwise would have no other access to finance service. Microfinance is a very popular term in today's financial market scenario. It allows people to take on reasonable small business loans safely, and in a manner that is consistent with ethical lending practices. Microfinance can be in the form of loans, insurance, and saving deposits. There are many people across the world, especially in India, who does not have access to proper financial assistance.

In 1983, Dr. Muhammad Yunus established Grameen Bank in Bangladesh. Muhammad Yunus, the Bangladeshi economist also known as the father of Microfinance. The goal of Grameen Bank was to initially provide small loans to entrepreneurs. In 2006, Yunus received the Nobel Peace Prize for his efforts with Grameen Bank. The bank currently oversees operational locations and employs about 22,000 individuals. Furthermore, there are currently 10,000 microfinance institutions. A few of model established

in India was like - Grameen Model, SHG Model (Self-help Groups), Federated SHG Model, etc.

A few key principles of micro-finance are listed as

- Need a variety of financial services, not just loans
- Powerful tool to fight poverty
- A very large number of people

There are a number of risks that a Microfinance usually faces risks that could be delinquencies, frauds, staff turnover, interest rate changes, liquidity, regulatory, etc. But all these risks can broadly be classified into four major categories - Credit risk, Operational risk, Market risk, and Strategic risk.

The goal of microfinance is to ultimately give impoverished people an opportunity to become self-sufficient. The World Bank estimates that more than 500 million people have benefited from microfinance operations. The beneficiaries of the Microfinance is Small and marginal farmers, rural artisans and weavers, Self-employed in the Urban Informal Sector, and nonfarm activities and women.

NEW EDUCATION POLICY

The new Education Policy came into existence on 29 July 2020, after replacing the existing National Education policy. The change in education policy is made after a gap of a total of 34 years. But the change was necessary and the need for the time should have been made earlier. Getting basic education is the birthright of each and every individual as per the Indian constitution.

The main motive is making a child learn along with becoming a skilled one, in whatever field they are interested. In this way, the learners are able to figure out their aim, and capabilities. The learners are to be preceded with integrated learning i.e., having the knowledge of every discipline. The same is applicable in higher education too. The new education policy also lays emphasis on the reformation of teacher education and the training process.

Advantages:-

- The new education policy focuses on the integrated development of the learners.
- It replaces the 10 + 2 system with 5 + 3 + 3 + 4 structure, which states 12 years of schooling and 3 years of pre - schooling, thus kids with the experience of schooling at an earlier stage.

- The examinations will be conducted in 3,5, and 8th grades only, others will go through the regular assessments.

Disadvantage:-

- The implementation of the language i.e. the teaching up to 5th grade to the continued in regional languages is the utmost problems.
- The child will be taught in regional language and therefore will have less approach towards the English language, which is a required complete grade.
- Kids have been subject to structure learning, which might increase the burden on their small minds.

The Framework of the Education Policy:-

1. The current policy replaces the National Education policy. (1986).
2. The discussion regarding the National Education policy was started in January 2015 by the committee under the leadership of cabinet secretary "TSR" Subramanian and a report was submitted by the committee in 2017.
3. The draft of National Education policy, made on the basis of the report of 2017.

4. It was submitted by the new team lead by the former ISRO chief. Krishnaswami Kasturirangan in 2019.
5. The New Education policy then came into existence on 29 July 2020.

Conclusion: -The present education system is a result of changes made in the existing education policy of 1986. It has been implemented to foster the learner and the nation's development. The new education policy focuses on the child's overall development. The policy is destined to achieve its objective by 2023
